



# Care and Maintenance:

Congratulations on choosing skylights that offer the easy care and maintenance of vinyl. Vinyl won't pit, peel or chalk over time. As a result, with only simple care and cleaning, your skylights can keep their beautiful appearance for years to come.

Like any surface exposed to outside elements, your skylights will get dirty from time to time, but cleaning them is a snap. Often, heavy rains will wash the skylight clean, but if the rain isn't enough, you can restore the splendor of the skylight by following these simple instructions.

Wash using mild detergent (if necessary) and a soft cloth or ordinary long-handled soft bristle brush. **Do not wash the skylight with a high pressure spray. The extreme pressure could crack or destroy the seal around the skylight.**

For difficult to remove dirt and stains use the readily available household cleaners listed on the chart. Follow the manufacturer's instructions on use of the cleaners.

Do not use liquid grease remover, strong soaps and detergents containing organic solvents, nail polish remover, furniture polish or cleaners containing chlorine bleach. These items could affect the surface appearance of the vinyl.

## **ACRYLIC & GLASS SKYLIGHT CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. To clean your Dayliter acrylic & glass skylight use ordinary soap (Ivory) and water with a soft cotton cloth or sponge
2. Grease, tar or paint can be removed using Methyl hydrate (wood alcohol), turpentine, naphta or kerosene and a soft cotton cloth. Rinse with soap and water.
3. **DO NOT USE:** Detergents, abrasive cleaners, petroleum products, thinners, scrapers or paper towels.
4. Minor scratches on acrylic skylights can be removed with Novus plastic polish (available from Dayliter) or a thin layer of auto polish and a light buffing with a soft cotton cloth.
